We're proud to share that our entire team has successfully completed ICS-300 certification — along with 30+ other amazing participants from several First Nation communities in Northern Alberta!



KTC Emergency Coordination Centre (ECC)

The Emergency Coordination Centre (ECC) in the KTC office is Located in Edmonton.

This ECC will serve as a centralized location for managing and coordinating response efforts during emergencies or disasters.

There are various agencies/organizations who come together during emergencies to ensure a unified response. This includes local, provincial, and federal entities.



FIRESMART HOME ASSESSMENT

KTC EMERGENCY SERVICES



Wildfires commonly occur in Alberta from March to October, though grassfires on KTC region lands are an allseasons hazard. It is important to prepare your home & property to reduce risks. 50% of home ignitions in wildfires are started by embers that ignite materials near homes.

One of the key ways to mitigate wildfire threats is to manage vegetation on properties in fire-prone areas



Prepare your Home and Property

Clean roof & gutters, move firewood, propane tanks, and combustible items (furniture, toys, decorations) a minimum of 10 m away from house.



Prepare Your Family

Have a family wildfire evacuation plan, build a 72-hour emergency kit, and conduct a FireSmart assessment of your home and property.



Stay Safe During a Wildfire

Wildfires, and especially grassfires, move very quickly - evacuate when told to do so, shut off gas, electric, and water main hookups prior to leaving.

APPLICATION OF FIRESMART PRINCIPLES

RECOMMENDING STEPS TO REDUCE FIRE SPREAD IN EACH PRIORITY ZONE



Immediate Zone (Om - 1.5m): Remove all ignitable material adjacent to home. Refurbish structure to reduce flammability. Prevent embers from igniting structure. Noncombustible surface should extend around the entire home and any attachments.

Intermediate Zone (1.5m - 10m): Limit fire spread near structures. Maintain a fire-resistant zone, free of all materials that could easily ignite from a wildfire.

Extended Zone (10m -30m): Wildland fuel reduction area. Reduce hazard with clean up, Complete maintenance and landscaping practices to eliminate surface fuels.

FIRESMART HOME ASSESSMENT **PROGRAM**



KTC Emergency Services is beginning an ongoing FireSmart Home Assessment Program (FHA) in all five KTC member nations. Your KTC Emergency Service Coordinators have completed advanced FireSmart training and will come and assess your home and property free of charge.

The FHA is a voluntary educational opportunity for KTC community members who want to better understand and mitigate wildfire risk at their homes, cabins, or businesses. An advanced FireSmart Home Assessment will highlight risk areas and recommend specific actions and upgrades residents can make to increase their property's resilience to wildfire**



"TO-GO BAG" LIST



When evacuating your home, having a well-prepared checklist can ensure that you have the essentials for your safety and well-being.

Here's a basic list to consider:

1. Emergency Documents:

- Identification (IDs, passports)
- Emergency contacts list
- Medical records and prescriptions
- Insurance papers
- Financial information (bank cards, cash)
- Important personal documents (birth certificates, titles)

2. Personal Items:

- Cell phone and charger
- Wallet/purse with cash and credit cards
- Glasses/contact lenses and solution
- Medications and medical supplies
- Personal hygiene items (toothbrush, soap, etc.)
- Clothing (change of clothes for a few days)

3. First Aid Kit:

- Basic first aid supplies (bandages, antiseptics, etc.)
- Prescription medications
- Pain relievers
- Any necessary medical equipment (e.g., inhalers)

4. Food and Water:

- Bottled water (at least 1 gallon per person per day for 3 days)
- Non-perishable food items (canned goods, granola bars, etc.)
- Baby food/formula, if needed





6. Shelter and Comfort:

- Tent or emergency shelter (if applicable)
- Pillows or comfort items for children or pets
- Personal protective equipment (masks, gloves)

7. Pets:

- Pet food and water
- Leash/collars for pets
- Pet carrier
- Vet records (especially for medications)

8. Vehicle Essentials:

(if evacuating by car)

- Full tank of gas
- Car charger for devices
- Tire repair kit, jumper cables
- Road maps (in case of GPS failure)

9. Miscellaneous:

- Local maps or evacuation routes
- Cash (small bills)
- Duct tape, zip ties, or any other securing materials
- A list of any special needs or requirements for family members
