# Message from the KTC Emergency Services Coordinators (ESC's)

As winter covers Alberta with snow, safe driving becomes essential. Here are key points to keep in mind:

### 1. Passing Snowplows

Always stay behind snowplows until it's safe to pass. Be cautious of reduced visibility and snow being thrown from the plow.

### 2. Log Trucks and Heavy Equipment

Maintain a safe distance from log trucks and oilfield heavy machinery. Their larger size means longer stopping distances, so wait for safe passing opportunities.

### 3. Icy Conditions and Slush

Reduce your speed and increase your following distance on icy and slushy roads. Avoid sudden movements to prevent skidding.

#### 4. Plan Ahead

Check weather and road conditions before traveling. Ensure your vehicle has winter-ready equipment and an emergency kit.

#### 5. Check In With Someone

Inform someone of your travel plans, especially in areas with poor cell reception. Share your route and expected arrival time.

By following these tips, you can enhance your safety and that of others on Alberta's winter roads. Stay safe!


### **Information Sessions**

### **All-Hazards Emergency Management Coordinator**



### **Job Summary**

The purpose of this position is to help the First Nation with the coordination of their all-hazards emergency management plans and activities, providing First Nations with the flexibility to identify what constitutes an emergency in their community. An all-hazards emergency management approach can include preparing for, mitigating, responding to, and recovering from structural fires, wildfires, floods, storms, earthquakes, communicable disease outbreaks, food and water contamination, mental wellness emergencies, etc. The All-Hazards Emergency Management Coordinator will collaborate with Indigenous Services Canada, the Province of Alberta, other municipalities, community leaders, and First Nations members to ensure the First Nations has the capacity to plan for, mitigate, and address their emergency management needs.



# "TO-GO BAG" LIST



When evacuating your home, having a well-prepared checklist can ensure that you have the essentials for your safety and well-being.

Here's a basic list to consider:

### 1. Emergency Documents:

- Identification (IDs, passports)
- Emergency contacts list
- Medical records and prescriptions
- Insurance papers
- Financial information (bank cards, cash)
- Important personal documents (birth certificates, titles)

#### 2. Personal Items:

- Cell phone and charger
- Wallet/purse with cash and credit cards
- Glasses/contact lenses and solution
- Medications and medical supplies
- Personal hygiene items (toothbrush, soap, etc.)
- Clothing (change of clothes for a few days)

### 3. First Aid Kit:

- Basic first aid supplies (bandages, antiseptics, etc.)
- Prescription medications
- Pain relievers
- Any necessary medical equipment (e.g., inhalers)

#### 4. Food and Water:

- Bottled water (at least 1 gallon per person per day for 3 days)
- Non-perishable food items (canned goods, granola bars, etc.)
- Baby food/formula, if needed





### 6. Shelter and Comfort:

- Tent or emergency shelter (if applicable)
- Pillows or comfort items for children or pets
- Personal protective equipment (masks, gloves)

#### 7. Pets:

- Pet food and water
- Leash/collars for pets
- Pet carrier
- Vet records (especially for medications)

### 8. Vehicle Essentials:

(if evacuating by car)

- Full tank of gas
- Car charger for devices
- Tire repair kit, jumper cables
- Road maps (in case of GPS failure)

### 9. Miscellaneous:

- Local maps or evacuation routes
- Cash (small bills)
- Duct tape, zip ties, or any other securing materials
- A list of any special needs or requirements for family members
